SUBJECT: Chief Executive Officer's Report

1. Purpose: To inform the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) of items of interest not addressed in the agenda.

A. FY2024-2029 Six Year Program

The Authority approved the Call for Regional Transportation Projects (CfRTP) for the FY2024-2029 Six Year Program (SYP) at its March 9, 2023, meeting. Accordingly, the online application portal opened on May 1st, 2023, for registered users from jurisdictions and agencies. The deadline for submitting applications is July 28th, 2023, at 5:00pm. The deadline for submitting resolutions of support from respective governing bodies is October 27th, 2023, at 5:00pm.

B. Preliminary Deployment Plan for a Regional Bus Rapid Transit System in Northern Virginia

NVTA staff held a Pre-Request for Proposal (RFP) Open House/Consultant Briefing on March 30th, 2023. The context of the Preliminary Deployment Plan for a Regional Bus Rapid Transit (PDP-BRT), purpose, coordination required, leveraging current and recent work, key elements of the scope, of work, and other pertinent information were shared. This was followed by a question & answer session. Request for Proposals (RFP) for the PDP-BRT was posted on April 6th, 2023. Clarification questions received within the deadline of April 12th, 2023, were answered and published on NVTA website by April 17th, 2023. The deadline for proposals is on May 11th, 2023.

C. Intelligent Transportation Society of Virginia Annual Conference

NVTA Regional Transportation Planner Mackenzie Love is a member of the Board of Directors for the Intelligent Transportation Society of Virginia (ITSVA) and has helped organize its <u>Annual Conference</u>. It will take place between May 10th and 11th, in Richmond, Virginia and comprises an audience of transportation technology specialists from the public and private sectors. A new feature of this year's event is a Poster Competition which creates the opportunity to share information with a state-wide audience. On behalf of NVTA, Mackenzie led the development of a successful submission to this competition and will attend the conference to share the resulting poster. The poster (Attachment A) focuses on NVTA's InNoVAtion Initiatives, which center on the Transportation Technology Strategic Plan (TTSP).

D. Bike to Work Day

On May 19th, NVTA staff will be participating in Bike to Work Day at the Town of Vienna pit stop located on the Town Green near Maple Avenue. Staff will be informing participants about NVTA's W&OD Trail investments in addition to NVTA's overall regional planning and programming role in Northern Virginia. Staff will be present from 7am to 9:30am and stationed alongside six other organizations.

E. NVTA's 10th and 20th Anniversary Celebration

NVTA will celebrate 20 years since the creation of the Authority and 10 years of dedicated transportation funding for regional multimodal, transportation investments that reduce congestion on June 8th, immediately following the conclusion of the June Authority meeting. The event will take place at Northern Virginia Associations of Realtors (NVAR) Fairfax Headquarters at 8407 Pennell St, Fairfax, VA 22031 with a program start time of 8pm. Invitations have been sent and current speakers include Chair Phyllis J. Randall, Delegate Vivian Watts, Former Governor Robert McDonnell, Former Delegate David Albo, and Former NVTA Chair Marty Nohe.

F. Bisnow Developing & Innovating NoVA's National Landing

On April 18th, I provided opening remarks to Bisnow's Developing & Innovating NoVA's National Landing event. I presented an overview of the nearly \$159 million NVTA has invested in National Landing and the \$97.27 million in the surrounding area and supporting transit systems (Arlington Transit (ART), Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA), and Virginia Railway Express (VRE) systems).

G. South Washington Transportation and History Plaza and South Washington and South Maple Intersection Improvements Projects Ribbon Cutting

On April 19th, NVTA joined the City of Falls Church, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), the Federal Transit Administration, and the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission to celebrate the completion of the South Washington Transportation and History Plaza and South Washington and South Maple Intersection Improvements projects. Chair Phyllis J. Randall provided remarks on behalf of NVTA and Vice Chair David Snyder spoke on the history of the project and its impact on the city. NVTA's total investment of nearly \$2.5 million toward these projects was allocated through both Regional Revenues and Local Distributions Funds to provide safer, more direct, and more attractive pedestrian connections to the Intermodal Plaza at the intersection of South Washington Street and Hillwood Avenue.



H. What's Next for Northern Virginia Transportation

On April 21st, I attended the Northern Virginia Transportation Alliance's What's Next for Northern Virginia Transportation event. Featured panelist were Virginia Deputy Secretary of Transportation John Lawson, VDOT Northern Virginia District Administrator and Authority member John Lynch, and Virginia Passenger Rail Authority Executive Director DJ Stadtler. Of note was a discussion on Northern Virginia's lack of High Priority Program Funds from Round 5 of SMART SCALE. Additionally, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) is scheduled to further discuss the review of SMART SCALE at their retreat in July and is expected to take action on recommended changes in October.

I. Balls Ford Road Interchange Ribbon Cutting

On April 27th, I attended the ribbon cutting for the Balls Ford Road Interchange in Prince William County. On July 13, 2017, NVTA recommended approval of the Balls Ford Road Interchange project for funding Transform 66 Outside the Beltway Concessionaire Payment to the CTB along with 25 additional projects.

J. Annual Northern Virginia Joint Transportation Meeting

On May 2nd, NVTA joined regional partners for the Annual Northern Virginia Joint Transportation Meeting held at the Virginia Department of Transportation's NoVA District Offices. Secretary of Transportation W. Sheppard Miller III opened the meeting discussing transportation safety and the regional collaboration necessary in improving NoVA's transportation network. I discussed the recent adoption of TransAction, NVTA's Core Values and goals, and informed the public on how to track project status in real

time through NVTA's NoVA Gateway. Chair Phyllis J. Randall and Chair Ann Wheeler were in attendance and provided remarks on funding of transportation across the region. During the open house prior to the meeting, NVTA staff greeted members of the public and demonstrated how to use the NoVA Gateway.

2. Monthly Factoid Talking Point

On May 11th, 2015, exactly 8 years ago to the date of the Authority meeting, NVTA celebrated the first groundbreaking ceremony on a series of Route 28 improvement projects spanning across Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William Counties and the cities of Manassas and Manassas Park. The nine initial allocations received \$99M in NVTA Regional Revenues and were funded in NVTA's FY2014 and FY2015-2016 funding programs. Since the inaugural groundbreaking, six projects have reached completion with the three remaining well underway:

In Prince William:

- Route 28 widening from Linton Hall Road to Fitzwater Drive, this includes the realignment of Vint Hill Road
- Route 28 widening from Route 234 Bypass to Linton Hall Road In Loudoun:
- Route 28 South widening from Sterling Boulevard to the Dulles Toll Road In Fairfax:
 - Route 28 North widening from McLearen Road to the Dulles Toll Road
 - Route 28 South widening from the Dulles Toll Road to Route 50
- Route 28 widening from the Prince William County Line to Route 29 In the City of Manassas:
 - Route 28 widening from Godwin Drive to the Southern City/Prince William County limits
 - Route 28 (Manassas Bypass) Study

The Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) is committed to taking a proactive approach to technology to build momentum for the innovative transportation system of tomorrow.


BUILDING **MOMENTUM**



The Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) develops Northern Virginia's long-range transportation plan, called TransAction. TransAction addresses regional transportation needs by identifying transportation projects that reduce congestion, enhance mobility, increase accessibility, and improve resiliency. The findings in TransAction are used to inform the NVTA's Six Year Program for Regional Revenue funding.

TransAction includes:

17 projects have technology as a primary



TransAction Vision Statement:

"Northern Virginia will plan for, and invest in, an Equitable, Safe, Sustainable, and integrated multimodal transportation system that enhances quality of life, strengthens the economy, and builds resilience."

NVTA's Legislative Priorities

A legislative priority to "Support use of effective transportation technology" was introduced into NVTA's State and Federal Legislative Program in 2022. The position has since been updated and continued.

Transportation Technology **Committee (TTC)**

The TTC was established in 2018 as an advisory Committee to NVTA's CEO. It is designed to advise the CEO on multimodal transportation technologies and related transportation trends that support (or endanger) the vision of the Authority, create an evidence-based body of knowledge, and more. For these reasons, the TTC championed development of the TTSP and continues to guide its

Regional Multi-Modal Mobility Program (RM3P)

"The RM3P's mission is to leverage the collaborative use of real-time data by Virginia's public and private sectors to improve travel safety, reliability, and mobility, and to give the public the tools to make more informed travel

NVTA is a Co-Sponsor of RM3P, working closely vith Virginia Department of Transportatio and Virginia's Department of Rail and Public Transportation.

Transportation Technology Strategic Plan (TTSP)

The NVTA Transportation Technology Strategic Plan (TTSP) was developed as a tool for establishing a proactive approach to innovation, which keeps congestion reduction top of mind. The full TTSP is maintained as a living document, to reflect the continued evolution of transportation technologies, and to allow the flexibility necessary to update and refine it as appropriate

The TTSP is comprised of strategies that are not specific to any one technology, but $\frac{1}{2}$ instead aim to guide use of technologies to further NVTA's vision for the region. In general, the plan seeks to maximize benefits of their use and minimize any potential negatives. The TTSP identifies 9 roles NVTA can take on in pursuing these strategies, which are explored through an Action Plan. All strategies and actions in the Plan are evaluated in terms of three Core Values:

The process begins with a Call for Regional Transportation Projects which allows eligible entities to apply for funding to advance projects from TransAction that align with regional transportation priorities.
