Re: Northern Virginia Transportation Authority's Six Year Program Priorities

Dear Members of the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority,

At the heart of better transportation is creating mixed-use, walkable, bike-able, transit-oriented communities so that people have more travel choices and we use our available assets more efficiently. Investments in public transportation create stronger, more attractive communities with cleaner air and vibrant economic centers. We envision a long-term Northern Virginia planning

approach that more effectively preserves farms, forests, and natural areas, reduces greenhouse gas emissions, and maximizes water quality, air quality, and economic equality and public health. Transit systems should be accessible, affordable and reliable. They should be easy to reach by walking or biking. People should be able to live, work, play within their towns and neighborhoods to support a strong local economy, clean environment and high quality of life.

The Northern Virginia Transportation Authority has worked for the last two years to a create a comprehensive list of transportation projects for the region. We support prioritizing funding to transit projects in Northern Virginia in the next regional funding program. As the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority selects projects under their Six Year Program, we ask that you provide funding for key projects that expand transportation choices and support more sustainable, walkable, transit-oriented communities. Otherwise we will face both far worse traffic and the severe negative impacts that result from widening roads at great cost to adjoining neighborhoods.

The following should be investment priorities for Northern Virginia Transportation Authority funds:

- 1. Focus transportation investments around Metro and VRE stations including a connected local street network of "complete streets" to facilitate "first and last mile" access to transit, including bicycling, walking, and bus connections
- 2. Focus new residential development near existing and planned Metro stations in Fairfax and Loudoun, VRE stations, and in commercial corridors being planned for and transformed into walkable, mixed-use, transit-oriented places, while protecting rural land on the periphery of suburbia
- 3. Rebuild Metro's rail and bus capital infrastructure and expanding its capacity to support compact development, serve more people., and maintain and strengthen our economic competitiveness
- 4. Expand VRE capacity on existing lines
- 5. Expand express bus service, maximizing transit use of HOV lanes on I-66, I-95, and create dedicated bus lanes on Route 50, Route 7, Route 28 and other major corridors, providing a faster, more reliable commute option
- 6. Make local bus service improvements to support all socio-economic demographics, connect people to jobs, and support mixed-use, walkable, transit-accessible neighborhoods:
  - Alexandria -- DASH
  - Arlington ART
  - Fairfax Connector
  - PRTC Omnilink
  - Loudoun Transit

- 7. New fixed-guideway transit in existing and emerging walkable, mixed-use areas:
  - Route 7, Alexandria to Tysons
  - Route 1 in Fairfax and Prince William
  - Columbia Pike
  - Gallows Road, Tysons to Inova, with local connection to Annandale

Northern Virginia is a thriving region, expected to grow by 1.6 million people by 2040. We need to utilize these planning strategies that help reduce driving demand and foster walkable, mixed-use areas. The most effective way to address traffic congestion is to build more walkable, mixed-use, transit-friendly communities connected by an expanded network of transit, including both local service and service on dedicated rights-of-way. Building better communities provides benefits for economic development and job creation, health, and the environment. Regional cooperation will bring accessible, affordable and reliable public transit to the entire Northern Virginia region and foster sustainable, attractive and competitive communities.
