


#### **About the TPB**


- National Capital Region



## What Visualize 2045 Says About CAVs

 Impacts of technological advances difficult to predict – degree and pace of adoption [of CAVs] is still unknown

Sure to impact surface transportation options and mobility overall, with unknown and potentially large impacts on the use of public transportation
