Beth Zgoda is a Transportation Senior Managing Consultant at ICF and has over 10 years of experience in sustainable transportation planning and policy. She conducts national research for federal clients to identify actionable strategies that transportation planners can use to make transportation more equitable and sustainable. Projects relevant to today's discussion include FHWA's Integrating Resilience into the Transportation Planning Process and Environmental Justice Analysis in Transportation Planning and Programming: State of the Practice. Other research has focused on equity analyses, NEPA, land use planning, and

healthy communities.

Beth applies her national-level research to statewide, regional, and local planning, including in the DC region. She is wrapping up support for Prince George's County in a pilot of FHWA's Framework for Better Integrating Health into Transportation Corridor Planning. Beth also supports the National Capital Regional Transportation Planning Board (TPB) with long-range planning, beginning with helping develop the Aspirational Initiatives in 2017. More recently, she has helped TPB staff identify measures relating to equity and resiliency, and she is assisting with planning and coordination relating to adaptation and resiliency.

Prior to joining ICF, Beth worked on transportation research for the U.S. EPA's Office of Sustainable Communities, which included supporting TCI. She began her transportation planning career as a fellow at Smart Growth America and intern with Rails-to-Trails Conservancy. Beth is licensed to practice law in Maryland, having graduated *magna cum laude* from American University's JD program in 2010. She has a BA in psychology from Ohio State University.
