

Construct Route 28 Corridor Roadway Improvements

NVTA FY2020-2025 SIX YEAR PROGRAM *Updated: 3/5/2020*

Project Description


The project consists of the design and construction of corridor improvements along Route 28 in Prince William County, between the City of Manassas and Fairfax County, and includes right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation. The project will either construct a bypass or widen existing Route 28. The project currently has \$89 million allocated in the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) FY2018-2023 Six Year Program. The project will improve travel times and reliability of the multi-modal transportation network through Prince William County and the Cities of Manassas and Manassas Park. The Route 28 Corridor Feasibility Study (completed in 2017) evaluated 10 preliminary alternatives and determined the top 4 highest ranking alternatives. The list of highest-ranking alternatives showed the greatest project benefits in terms of traffic reduction, travel time savings, environmental impacts, socioeconomic impacts, right of way impacts and estimated project costs. There are currently three alternatives for the project being

reviewed as part of environmental studies; Alternative 2A, 2B, and 4. Alternative 2A constructs a bypass/new four-lane roadway on a new alignment and extends Godwin Drive north from the existing Godwin Drive/Sudley Road intersection, parallels Flat Branch, then turns east following the south side of Bull Run until joining existing Route 28. Alternative 2B also constructs a bypass/new 4-lane roadway on a new alignment and extends Godwin Drive north from the existing Godwin Drive/Sudley Road intersection, parallels Flat Branch, then turns east following the south side of Bull Run until Old Centreville Road where it crosses Bull Run at the existing crossing of Old Centreville Road and joins existing Route 28 north of Bull Run. Alternative 4 would widen Route 28 on its existing alignment from 4 to 6 lanes between Liberia Avenue and the Fairfax County line. Alternatives will include bicycle/pedestrian facilities along the length of the project. Prince William County in partnership with the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), is in the process of preparing the environmental documentation for the project and the Environmental Assessment is currently underway. It is anticipated that based on the United States Army Corps of Engineers permitting process, the final alignment will be determined sometime in early 2020.
