NORTHERN VIRGINIA TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (NVTA) TO CHANGE MARCH 13, 2014 MEETING LOCATION TO FAIRFAX CITY HALL DUE TO POWER OUTAGE

10455 Armstrong Street, Fairfax, Virginia*

NORTHERN VIRGINIA – As of 11:57 am today, the location of the March 13, 2014 meeting of the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) has been changed because of emergency circumstances related to a total building power outage at the NVTA's offices located at 3060 Williams Drive Fairfax, VA 22030.

In accordance with the Authority's bylaws, two members of the Authority have requested that Chairman Nohe move the March 13, 2014 meeting to [Fairfax City Hall located at 10455 Armstrong Street Fairfax, VA](#). The meeting will begin at the previously noticed start time of 7:00 pm. The previously posted agenda for the March meeting will be considered at the new meeting location.

NVTA has posted signage at 3060 Williams Drive directing the public to the new location and updated the NVTA web site accordingly. In addition, the Authority is notifying Authority members, the Jurisdictional Agency Coordinating Committee, the Public Information Officers of the Authority's member jurisdictions and the media of this meeting location change via e-mail and this media release.
